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Introduction

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Create a Wish List

It's time to dream big!

There's always room to scale back an idea later on. It's actually easier to whittle down a big vision in order for it to mesh with a feasible budget and other restrictions than it is to come up with a basic plan and add details as you go.

Now is the time to make a wish list of everything you'd love to see. Make it as long and as comprehensive as you like, and leave no idea unexplored.

Of course, your wish list can vary greatly depending on what room or area you're remodeling. And each person will have his or her own wish list, too, which is why it's important to create yours from scratch, rather than using someone else's.

To get started, ask yourself what the biggest problem is with the existing room or space, or the number one reason you're remodeling in the first place.

Then ask yourself how you would ideally like to use that room. What type of features will help get you to that end result? Envision your home and your lifestyle, not just in the immediate future, but also in five or ten years. How will the project help you accomplish this?

Let's face it, your 25-point wish list may never be 100 percent complete. So, once you have your master wish list, it's time to prioritize it. Here's a simple way to break it down:



What is the number one, must-have for this project?



What are the top three items that would make you most happy to have at the end of the project?



What are the remaining wish list items that would be nice to have, but wouldn't necessarily be a deal breaker to go without?



Establish Your Budget

The part of the remodeling process that most people dread is the budget. How much is this project going to cost? What can you afford? Will your expectations match up with your budget?

Many homeowners underestimate how much their dream project is going to cost. That's why it's important to be realistic.

The main elements that impact your budget include:

- The size and scope of your project
- The type of materials used
- Appliances
- Plumbing and electrical work
- Structural changes
- Age and condition of the home
- Overall craftsmanship and quality

Don't forget to plan for unexpected costs, too. Estimates are "estimates" for a reason, and sometimes, even with the best intentions, unexpected expenses come up.




Find the Right Contractor for the Job

Research

If you can, reach out to suppliers and subcontractors that have worked with the contractor to get their opinions on how the company handles projects and timelines.

Receiving a direct referral or recommendation from a trusted friend, neighbor, or family member is great. They'll be able to speak to the quality of the finished project and the process of working with the contractor.

Interview

Don't limit yourself to only looking online. Use that as a starting point to begin narrowing down the selection. From there, speak with several different contractors. Here are a few questions you may want to ask:

- Are you properly licensed and insured?
- Do you have references you can provide?
- How long have you been in business?
- How many projects have you completed that are similar to mine?
- How many projects do you work on at once?
- Will you be able to meet my budget and deadline?
- What is your policy for job site cleanliness?
- What happens when I can't get a hold of you?
- Can I visit a current job site?



Overall, does a particular contractor seem like an upfront, honest individual you can trust with your project, your money, and your home?

Will you enjoy working with them, and do you think they have a good sense of what you're looking for and how they'll be able to accomplish it?

Estimates

Of course, you may wish to receive bids or estimates from several different contractors. You want to ensure that each bid deals with the exact same scope of work and specifications so you can directly and fairly compare them.

Some contractors may try to hide certain costs, or may fail to explain how they arrived at particular totals. So be sure to ask about anything you don't understand, and ensure you receive clear answers.

Conversely, estimates that seem too cheap, or too good to be true, may end up being just that. The contractor could be cutting some corners with the quality of the project, the time he takes, and his craftsmanship, or the grade of materials he's using.






Create Your Timeline

Different projects will require different amounts of time to complete. There's more to it than simply getting the contractor into the house to get the job done.

You have to consider both the amount of time the contractor will actually need to do the work in the house, as well as the overall completion time of a project from start to finish. This includes hiring, planning, acquiring permits, and ordering materials.

- Does your neighborhood have a window of restricted hours for noisy construction projects?
- Do you have a pet? Will you need to adjust it's normal schedule in order to keep it out of harms way?

Most contractors should be able to work around your schedule to suit your needs and your lifestyle. As with all other factors, consider how that affects the project's completion date.

For large projects, like total home renovations or exterior additions, you may want to plan to get out of town during some portions of the work.
